Saboteur

A lesser-known Alfred Hitchcock thriller that has intrigue and suspense. You might need to explain the plotline to younger children. (All ages)

You've probably heard of Frank Capra's Christmas classic, *It's a Wonderful Life*. This comedy is classic Capra too. It's about a simple man who inherits a whole lot of money. (All ages)



Abbot and Costello Meet Frankenstein

Flipper

Before there was Winter (the dolphin), there was *Flipper*. This is the endearing story of a Florida boy and the dolphin who becomes his buddy. (All ages)
