Get Moving.

Get outside and spend some time setting up an obstacle course in your backyard. Use things you already have lying around your house like hula hoops and basketballs. Have your kids start by doing five pushups, then running to hula hoops and hula hooping for 10 seconds. After that, have them sprint to the basketball net, and whoever makes 5 baskets first wins! If it is raining, take the obstacle course indoors, and get creative with indoor household items like pillows, bouncy balls, and eggs.

Science Shmience.

Do some basic experiments using every-day items. A simple one is the classic Diet Coke and Mentos explosion! Roll up 3 Mentos in a piece of paper, quickly drop them into a liter of Diet Coke, and watch the soda explode! Or try easily inflating a balloon! Fill a bottle with an inch of warm water and a packet of yeast. Take an average-size balloon and stretch it out a couple of times. Then, take the neck of the balloon and put it over the top of bottle, securing it tightly to make sure no air escapes. Now, watch as the balloon magically inflates!

Kitchen Creativity.

Dig out your recipe book, and make something tasty. Try a new dessert like beignets or homemade fruit popsicles, or go all out and create a whole meal! Or for something different, bake a "family cookie" by having each child contribute in a special way like mixing, breaking the eggs, measuring the flour, etc. You can also check out some of our favorite recipes at iMOM!
